Neighborhood Watch Program

Meet fellow residents, voice your concerns, help set up a watch program on your street, and get a chance to work with the Mayfield Heights Police Department.

Sign up for Civic Ready (on city website)

Receive emergency alerts and severe weather warnings (via text, email or voice mail) that might directly impact you and your family and may require action to be taken. Non-emergency alerts may include transportation problems with prolonged impacts or significant ongoing police or fire activity.

Service Department 440-442-2629

Responsible for maintaining all public infrastructure and rights-of-way, including streets, municipal facilities and parks, and traffic systems.

Garbage Pick Up (schedule on city website)

Do not place trash at the curb earlier than 6 p.m. on the day prior to collection or later than 7 a.m. on the day of collection. Holiday pickups will be delayed one day, as will collections for that week's remaining days.

Curbside Recycling

Combine paper, cardboard, cans, cartons, glass and plastics in the provided bright green cart. **NO SORTING NEEDED!**
